Examples of projects that have been funded

Investing in an:

- Aboriginal business
- Aboriginal sole trader
- Aboriginal corporation running an enterprise
- Funds for an <u>Aboriginal sole</u> <u>trader</u> to buy machinery and equipment and pay for operational costs like wages and book keeping for 12 months to develop land to start a horticulture business
- Funds for an <u>Aboriginal-owned funeral business</u> to buy machinery, equipment and vehicles to start operating
- Funds for an <u>Aboriginal-owned café</u> to buy assets and equipment to help an grow and offer more services
- Funds for an <u>Aboriginal</u> <u>business</u> to develop a business plan to help the business grow

Aboriginal-owned infrastructure connected to an economic activity

- Funds for an <u>Aboriginal-owned cattle station</u> to put in water infrastructure (bores) and do fencing to expand their business
- Funds for an <u>Aboriginal-owned farm</u> to build accommodation on site for trainers and mentors
- Funds for CLC to build three new ranger bases in communities

Small infrastructure projects that create jobs or improve Aboriginal land

 Funds for CLC to work with rangers and traditional owners to build a fence to protect a sacred site

Building skills of women and men on country

 Funds for an <u>Aboriginal</u> <u>corporation</u> to purchase vehicles and equipment and pay wages for 12 months for mentors and community members to train and work on a farm

What can ABA stimulus funding be used for?

Investing in an:

- Aboriginal business
- Aboriginal sole trader
- Aboriginal corporation running an enterprise

Assets

- Equipment
- Vehicles
- Wages (max. 18mths)
- Office fit-out
- Other items to improve business performance (software, website, help with book keeping)



Aboriginal-owned infrastructure connected to an economic activity

- Ablution block for a tourist campground
- Infrastructure for a cattle station e.g. shed
- Infrastructure for a horticulture business e.g. water infrastructure
- Office or accommodation for an Aboriginal business



Small infrastructure projects that create jobs or improve Aboriginal land

- Solar power, water, fencing, or repairs for an Aboriginal business or Aboriginal corporation
- Small infrastructure project that creates jobs for local people
- Fencing to improve land (e.g. protect sacred sites)
- Outstation upgrades (if eligible- check the **Guide- Outstation** Upgrades- CLC ABA Economic Stimulus)



Building skills of women and men on country

- Ranger program (independent from CLC)
- Learning on country program
- Wages for an Aboriginal business or corporation or other provider to do work experience, training, or mentoring that leads to jobs

Funding Category

Building skills on country

Funding cannot be used for the below activities

Examples

- Starting a new business
- Paying off debt
- A project that is worth 10% or less of the applicant's cash at bank
- Infrastructure that is only for cultural, social, or environmental activities e.g. school, clinic, cultural centre, aged care centre.
- A project that improves community infrastructure but does not create jobs
- A small infrastructure project that does not have a business or organisation to manage the project
- Upgrades for an outstation that is not eligible (check the Guide-Outstation Upgrades-CLC ABA Economic Stimulus Funding)

 A program for Aboriginal training or work experience that will stop when stimulus funding runs out
